The Rushdie Letters

Freedom to Speak, Freedom to Write

In February 1989 Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini of Iran announced that Salman Rushdie, author of The Satanic Verses, and "all involved in its publication who were aware of its content, are sentenced to death Four years later, the International Committee for the Defence of Salman Rushdie and His Publishers invited internationally renowned authors to write public letters to Rushdie, responding to the most extreme example of censorship in modern times. This volume collects their letters, Rushdie's reply, his essay on his exile, "1,000 Days in a Balloon," and a chronology of the fatwa.

Nobel laureate Nadine Gordimer asks, "Is international terrorism acceptable so long as it is invoked by a great and respected religion?" Margaret Atwood writes, "Freedom of conscience sounds kind of soppy, until you remember how many died in the process of achieving it." Other authors include Saul Bellow, Peter Carey, Günther Grass, Mario Vargas Llosa, Norman Mailer, José Saramago, Gertrud Seehaus, Tom Stoppard, William Styron, Paul Theroux, Dragan Velikic, and Arnold Wesker.
