St. Cyprian The Lapsed and the Unity of the Catholic Church

St. Cyprian's writings give us an insight into the life of the Christian Church in the middle of the third century. The two pastoral addresses of this devoted Bishop which are here translated reveal the aftermath of the persecution of the Emperor Decius (A.D. 250-1): many had betrayed the faith—what was to be done with them? Again, divisions had arisen in certain local churches and threatened to spread—but could the Church of Christ be divided? The Lapsed answers the first question: the guilty must do penance before they can resume their place among the faithful. The Unity of the Catholic Church insists that there is no possible justification for breaking away from the authorites of the Church—the legitimate successors of those whom Christ had appointed Himself, Peter and the other Apostles.

The Liturgy of the Roman Church

ARCHDALE A. KING

Archdale King has established himself as a great authority on the history of the public prayer of the Church. In previous books he has covered the religious orders and the primatial sees. Now he crowns his work with a survey of the Roman liturgy itself. Part I introduces the book with a historical summary. Part II covers everything except the celebration of the Mass in itself, dealing with a long list of subjects including language, reservation, pontificalia, incense, chant, etc. The third part is concerned simply with the celebration of Mass. Ten appendices cover a number of more specialised matters, from the Restored Order of Holy Week to Byzantine influence on the Roman Rite. Ready September. 45s. net
