## **TOURS TO INDIA AND EAST AFRICA**

The FPS tour to India in February 1968 will be led by Sir Hugh Elliott, with Mr Zafar Futehally of Bombay and Mr E. P. Gee of Assam. The tour is now fully booked, but any member who would like to be put on a waiting list in case of a last minute cancellation (this quite often happens) should write to Miss Giles at once.

The East African bird tour, which leaves at the end of January for Kenya and Tanzania, will be led by Mr Leslie Brown, well-known expert on East African wildlife, of Nairobi, with Mr N. R. ## **TOUR TO JORDAN**

The plan for an FPS tour to Jordan in the spring (April-May) of 1968 has been prepared, and we should be glad to hear from any members who would like to consider joining this, assuming that the political situation made it practicable. The recent territorial losses in Jordan have affected the tour very little, and the best wildlife areas—the desert including Wadi Rum and Azraq—can still be visited, not to mention outstanding monuments such as Jerash and Petra.
