There are essays by the Bishop of Derby (for the Anglican Church); Fr Bernard Leeming, S.J., an Orthodox Archpriest (Fr Vladimir Rodzianko), the General Secretary of the Baptist Union and leading representatives of the Congregational, Presbyterian, and Methodist Churches, the Secretary of the British Council of Churches, and a layman of the Church of South India.
