This work opens with a survey of the geographical characteristics of the Croatian lands which include Dalmatia, Bosnia, Hercegovina, eastern Istria, Slavonia and Croatia proper. The movement into these areas of Alans, Avars, Goths, Slavs and other elements who have contributed to the Croatian blood stream are traced in detail. Relations with the Avars, Franks, Byzantines, Venetians and Hungarians form the subject of the second section of this volume. The final chapters concern themselves with the union effected between Croatia-Slavonia and Hungary in the era 1091-1526. A chapter on medieval Bosnia supplements the story of the Croatians during the middle ages. Maps and an extensive bibliography complete the treatise.

# THE FRENCH ARMY IN MEXICO

1861-1867

A STUDY IN MILITARY GOVERNMENT

(= *Studies in American History*, II)

The establishment of a military government on foreign soil taxes the discipline and training of an army to its utmost. In periods of actual combat no one expects anything else. But after the wave of combat has passed and an army has seized control of a land, what happens to the inhabitants?

The French Intervention in Mexico (1861-1867) provides a good case study of the problems facing an army of occupation: military combat, occupation of foreign soil, opposition by both organized and disorganized resident inhabitants, support by some elements of the residents, efforts to substitute military personnel for civil officers, assumption of sovereign rights to military chain of command, attempts to establish a friendly, substitute civil government that will allow the military to withdraw from those functions, the problems of fighting and governing at the same time, withdrawal from an area without leaving a competent body behind, and cultural conflicts arising from the occupation of foreign lands. Since military government is a highly authoritarian operation, particular focus was necessary in this study on the personalities representing the high military command; in this case Marshal François-Achille Bazaine is a key figure. With the romantic figures of Maximilian and his Empress – the tragic fate of the royal pair has always made an appeal to popular imagination – and, on the other hand, the stern and unbending stoicism of Juárez, the cast for the drama seems virtually complete.

The present account is primarily based on the official papers of Marshal Bazaine, a great many of which fortunately have survived. Further sources were the records of the royal family in Vienna, scattered records left by Austrian and Belgian officials, official French records – consisting mostly of correspondence between Paris and the headquarters in Mexico –, the official Mexican records in the capital, and personal correspondence and memoirs, printed and unprinted, of French soldiers and officials, important Mexican figures, etc.
