Accepted papers are published in the order of their receipt. Except for such papers as may be specially solicited, all papers bear the date of submission.

Manuscripts must be typewritten in standard $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$ paper, double spaced, and on one side of the page only. Bibliographies must follow a standard form. Citations from journals should be given as follows:
