NOTICE

This issue completes Volume II of AMERICAN ANTIQUITY. On July 1, the mailing list of the journal will be revised, and further issues will not be sent to those who are more than one year in arrears in dues. We earnestly request that all 1936 dues be paid before June 30.

By action of the Society at the annual meeting in Washington in December 1936, the fiscal year was changed to begin on July 1 instead of January 1, thereby coordinating the fiscal year and the whole volumes of American Antiquity. Therefore, the dues for 1936 will cover an 18-month period, and those for 1937 become payable on July 1. This revision does not affect the distribution of the journal, since annual dues have always covered a subscription to a complete volume.
