## Part 3 Practice

A Slowly, with five stresses, use a falling tone on the first syllable of 'finish':

// it MIGHT Even TAKE a YEAR to Finish it //

B A bit faster, with four stresses, with a falling tone starting on the first syllable of 'person':

// it might Even TAKE a YEAR to Finish it //

C Faster again, with two stresses, at different speeds. Make the words in capital letters loud and clear, and all the other words soft. Start a falling tone start on 'year' and continue over 'finish it'.

C1 // it MIGHT even take a YEAR to finish it // 120

C2 // it MIGHT even take a YEAR to finish it // 200

C3 // it MIGHT even take a YEAR to finish it // 300
