



AI Policy for Content Creators

1. AI must be declared and clearly explained in all work submitted to Cambridge for publication.
2. AI does not meet the Cambridge requirements for authorship, given the need for accountability. AI and LLM tools may not be credited or attributed as an author on any work published by Cambridge.
3. Any use of AI must not breach Cambridge's plagiarism [policy](#). Work must be the author's own and not present others' ideas, data, words or other material without adequate citation and transparent referencing.
4. Authors are accountable for the accuracy, integrity, and originality of their work, including for any use of AI.
5. AI should not be used to generate images or other content unless it is clear the appropriate copyright permissions have been obtained for both the training purposes and outputs of the tool.
6. No Cambridge content (including manuscripts under consideration) should be submitted to generative AI tools without explicit permission from the intellectual property owner and appropriate confidentiality safeguards in place (for example, a private LLM).
