The goal of *New Entomological Taxa* is to provide taxonomists with **timely** information from the taxonomic literature involving Arachnida, Acari, Insecta, and Myriapoda, in a form that is **affordable** not only to the growing ranks of underfunded libraries and research groups, but even to individual scientists and amateur entomologists. This goal is achieved by focusing only on the taxonomic literature of these arthropod groups, and by offering all of the information catalogued in both printed form and on the Internet. Since many taxonomists focus on one Order (or one Family) of organisms, we offer subscriptions to one of eight different taxonomic sections at a fraction of the cost of the full version of *New Entomological Taxa*. Each section contains the same indexing structure as the full version. **Subscription prices start at US \$25/year** (that's \$2 per monthly issue!) for a personal Internet subscription to one of the taxonomic sections. Our journal coverage now includes over 850 titles and continues to expand. Most entomology, taxonomy, general zoology, and parasitology journals are represented. Many specific palaeontology and earth science journals (which publish new fossil taxa) and journals which publish new taxa of parasites and pathogens of arthropods (i.e. nematology, mycology, microbiology and even botanical journals) are also included. About 40 more general biology, zoology and natural history journals have been added since the list in Issue 2 of *New Entomological Taxa* was printed. A noteworthy feature of *New Entomological Taxa* is the list of *Titles of Some Articles to Appear in Next Month's Issue*: During the two to three weeks involved in processing the references for an issue, many more relevant papers appear in the literature. This list of titles informs subscribers of relevant articles within a very short time after their publication.
