Affiliated Societies and Local Branches.

The Mathematical Association meets, as a whole, once a year at the Annual General Meeting held in London in January. The periodical meetings of the Association have been discontinued, and are now replaced by the periodical meetings of affiliated societies and local branches.

Any member of the Association may be enrolled as a member of one, but not more than one, local branch or affiliated society, without any payment beyond the annual subscription of ten shillings paid to the Association.

Any other person may become an associate of a branch, or of an affiliated society, subject to the approval of the local committee, on payment of a small subscription levied to meet local expenses. Such an associate is entitled to receive all reports published by the Association, but is not entitled to receive the Mathematical Gazette. An associate may attend all General Meetings of the Association, but may not vote on matters of business.

The branches named on the enclosed list have already been established, and the Council of the Association will be glad to co-operate in any steps for the formation of others, wherever a number of persons interested in the teaching of mathematics wish to meet for the purpose of discussion and for mutual help.
