BRITISH ABILITY SCALES

Colin Elliott et al

PERSONAL DISTRESS INVENTORY AND SCALES

Alan Bedford and Graham Foulds

Following on from work reported by Foulds (1965) in *Personality and Personal Illness* and experience gained with the measures developed in collaboration principally with T M Caine and K Hope, a second series of research studies was commenced in 1970.

The term 'personal distress' was used to indicate that concern was with people in distress and with those persons who cause distress in others. Accordingly, the new measures have been devised to assess separately personal illness and personality deviance.

The scales comprise The Delusions Symptoms—States Inventory (DSSI) and its derivatives, The Personal Disturbance Scale (DSSI/sAD) and DSSI/NS (Neurotic Symptoms) and the Personality Deviance Scales.

PERSONAL QUESTIONNAIRE RAPID SCALING TECHNIQUE (PQRST) David Mulhall

The PQRST provides a technique for the construction of idiographic personal questionnaires and represents a development of the pioneering work in the area by M B Shapiro.

The techniques make possible the measurement of subjective intensity of such phenomena as symptoms, feelings, attitudes and beliefs. Successive measurements of this kind can assist in monitoring the progress of therapy or assessing changes of attitude or mood.

FAMILY RELATIONS TEST CHILDREN'S VERSION REVISED MANUAL

Experience in using FRT has lead to some slight changes in the instructions for administration which also attempts to involve the child in the testing procedure rather more. A section has been added on the combined use of the Children's, Adults' and Married Couples' versions of FRT and some norms are provided for the Children's edition.
