Evocation de Junípero Serra, Fondateur de la Californie (The Unknown Serra, Founder of California). By Maximin C. J. Piette.

Historians have hitherto been unable to evoke the authentic figure of Serra as he really was in flesh and blood, for they lacked the direct contact with him that can be attained only by persevering study of the thousands of pages of his unpublished correspondence. Only in his letters does his personality stand out as though clearly

projected on a silver screen. And it is a joy to behold.

In these two works, readers will experience an extraordinary charm and will acquire a unique spiritual enrichment, and it will then be possible for them to enter into direct contact with Serra and to enjoy Les Lettres de Junipero (The Letters of Junipero), a complete collection of his neat manuscripts, a total of two hundred and seventy-one which have been discovered up to the present time. All these orginal writings will soon appear in both Spanish—English, and Spanish—French critical editions.

The author and editor earned the sympathy and respect of the scholarly world with his book entitled John Wesley in the Evolution of Protestantism, which has been published in several French and English editions [Sheed and Ward]. This work, which was crowned by the French Academy in 1927, still enjoys a unanimous reception and is

considered authoritative in all Catholic and Protestant circles.

As a result of extensive research in Harvard University on the religious evolution of North America, Father Maximin Piette, who came to the New World in 1927, under the auspices of Louvain University and the Herbert Hoover C.R.B. Educational Foundation, was well equipped to study early California history. In 1940 his attention was attracted, charmed, and won over by the noble personality of Fray Junipero Serra, the pioneer apostle of the Golden State.

The present study is a work of pure historical criticism-patient, objective, and honest. Written in a clear, fluid, concise, humanistic style, it reads like a moving epic.

It will captivate all who love the Missions, California, history, and truth.
