1. Articles should be submitted online at <http://mc.manuscriptcentral.com/nbfr>. 2. Articles will not be considered for publication if they have been previously published in English or are currently being considered for publication elsewhere.

3. Articles should normally be 5–7500 words in length, including notes, though longer articles may sometimes be considered.

4. All contributions should have an abstract (150–200 words) and 5 keywords describing the contents of the article, for web searching purposes.

5. Contributions should be submitted, typed double-spaced on one side of the paper, or preferably as e-mail attachment to [nb.editor@english.op.org](mailto:nb.editor@english.op.org).

6. Greek and Hebrew etc., should be transliterated.

7. Notes (preferably footnotes) should be numbered sequentially throughout the article.

8. Submissions may follow either UK or US spelling conventions, provided that they are consistent.
