P-734 - VISUAL FIELD DEFICIT: AN EARLY PRESENTATION IN DEMENTIA

Case report: Literature shows that visual field deficits is a common finding in alzheimer's dementia. It may even occur before the disease become manifest in it's classical form. This case report present a retired university professor presenting visual field defect before clear manifestations of Alzheimer's disease appear.
