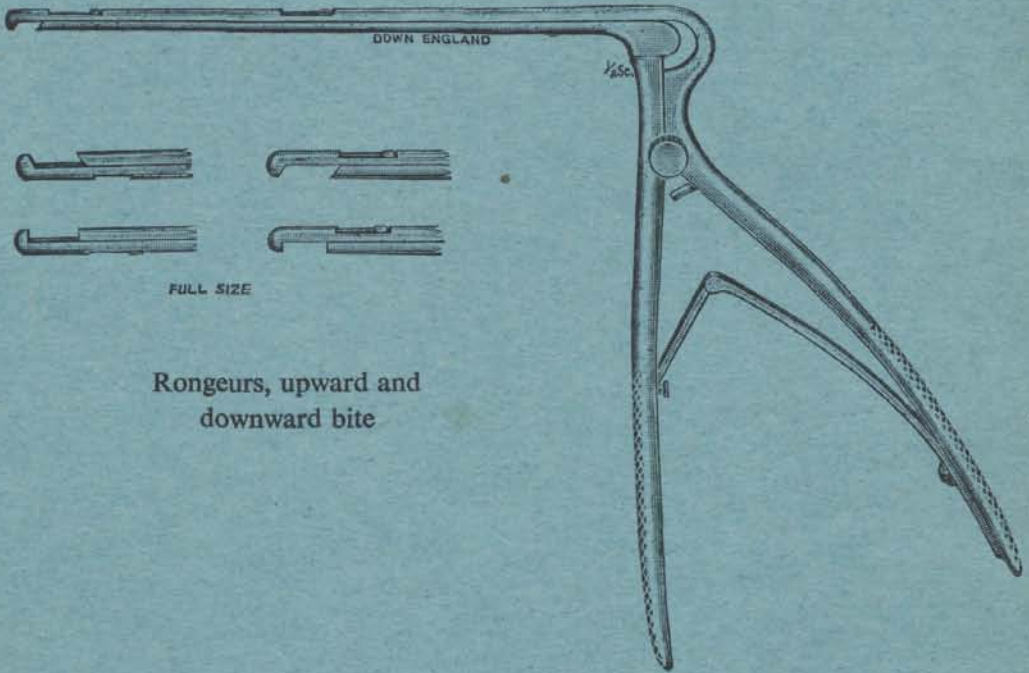
Die Vorträge werden in einem eigenem Kongressband publiziert, der allen Mitgliedern der Gesellschaft kostenlos zugeht.

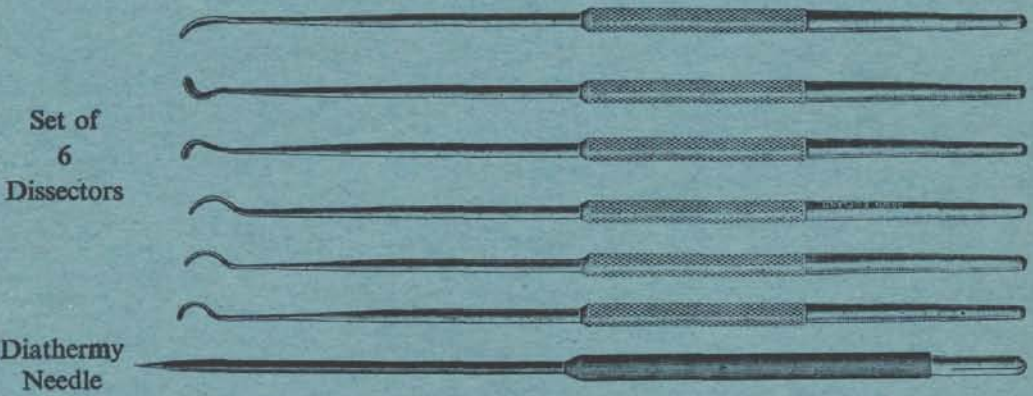
