#### **CONTRIBUTORS**

William K. Frankena has, since 1978, been Emeritus Professor of Philosophy at the University of Michigan. He has been a Visiting Professor and Lecturer at Harvard University, Columbia University, Tokyo University, the University of Washington, Princeton University, and the University of Texas. His many publications on ethics and political philosophy include Ethics (Prentice-Hall, 1973), Some Beliefs About Justice (University of Kansas, 1966), and Thinking About Morality (University of Michigan Press, 1980).

**John Kekes** is Professor of Philosophy and Public Policy at the State University of New York at Albany. He is the author of *A Justification of Rationality* (Albany, 1976) and *The Nature of Philosophy* (Oxford, 1980). He is currently completing a book on social philosophy.

T. H. Irwin is Professor of Philosophy at Cornell University. He is the author of *Plato's Moral Theory* (Oxford, 1977), and the translator of Plato's *Gorgias* (Oxford, 1979), and Aristotle's *Nicomachean Ethics* (Indianapolis, 1985).

Alan Gewirth is Edward Carson Waller Distinguished Service Professor of Philosophy at the University of Chicago. His books include Reason and Morality, Human Rights: Essays on Justification and Applications, and Marsilius of Padua and Medieval Political Philosophy. He is a Fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and a past President of both the American Philosophical Association (Western Division) and the American Society for Political and Legal Philosophy.

Baruch Brody is Professor of Philosophy at Rice University and the Leon Jaworski Professor of Biomedical Ethics at Baylor College of Medicine. He is currently completing a book (to be published by Oxford University Press) which explains the ways in which pluralistic moral theories can deal with hard cases in biomedical ethics. His most recent book, edited with H. T. Engelhardt, Jr., is *Bioethics: Readings and Cases* (Prentice-Hall, 1987).

David Sidorsky is Professor of Philosophy at Columbia University. His major fields of interest are political philosophy and ethical theory. Among his publications in these areas are "Contemporary Reinterpretation of Human

Rights" in a volume he edited entitled Essays in Human Rights; "Are Rules of Moral Thinking Neutral?" in Mind; and "Contextualism, Pluralism and Distributive Justice," in the first volume of Social Philosophy & Policy.

John O'Connor was educated at Cornell and Harvard Universities and taught at Vassar College, Case Western Reserve University, and the University of Delaware. He served as Executive Secretary of the American Philosophical Association and is currently Assistant Director for Programs at the National Humanities Center. He has written numerous scholarly articles and is the editor of *Modern Materialism* and co-editor of *Moral Problems in Medicine*. He serves as Chair of the Panel on Data Concerning the Education and Employment of Doctorate Recipients for the National Research Council.

Michael K. Hooker is currently Chancellor of the University of Maryland-Baltimore County. He is also past President of Bennington College and a former Dean of Undergraduate and Graduate Studies at the Johns Hopkins University. His research interests include bioethics and biotechnology.
