# Summer School of Linguistics

University of Alberta, Canadian Linguistic Association University of Alberta, Edmonton

TENTATIVE PLANS are now being made to resume in July and August, 1964, after a year's interruption, the series of linguistic programmes which has been available at the University of Alberta, Edmonton, during the previous five summers. A wide range of courses, dealing with general, descriptive, historical, applied, and anthropological linguistics, will be available. A special programme of lectures, films, and discussions of various topics is also planned. Courses will be conducted by a substantially increased staff of linguists at the University of Alberta and by visiting scholars from other Canadian and American universities. All courses carry University credit.

The University has recently initiated a research project on American-Indian Linguistics under which graduate students will investigate the structure of American-Indian languages and dialects. In order to explore and discuss further the problems and needs of this field, an attempt will be made to conduct during the period of the Summer School of Linguistics a Conference on American-Indian Linguistics.

Prospective Canadian participants in the Summer School of Linguistics are eligible to apply for financial assistance to the Canada Council, 140 Wellington Street, Ottawa. United States citizens and other non-Canadians should direct their inquiries regarding financial aid to the American Council of Learned Societies, 345 East 46th Street, New York 17, N.Y. A limited number of small grants, some especially earmarked for particular courses, will be made available by the Canadian Linguistic Association to qualified students registered in full programmes in linguistics.
