The Society, founded in 1910 and based in London, is the leading organization for all those interested in the study of Rome and the Roman Empire. Its scope is wide, covering Roman history, archaeology, literature and art down to about AD 700. It has a broadly based membership, drawn from over 35 countries and from all ages and walks of life. The Society publishes the *Journal of Roman Studies*, which deals with the Roman world in general, and also *Britannia*, a journal of Romano-British and connected studies, which includes an annual survey of Romano-British excavations.

The Society maintains with the Hellenic Society and in conjunction with London University's Institute of Classical Studies a joint library of works on classical antiquity. Members resident in or visiting the UK may consult and borrow books belonging to the Institute. Meetings of the Society are held in London, and in other parts of the UK together with other societies. An archaeology conference is held in alternate years, usually at a venue outside London. Triennial conferences with the Hellenic Society and the Classical Association are held in either Oxford or Cambridge.

Annual subscriptions: Members and Schools, $\pounds 46/US \$92$ for either the *JRS* or *Britannia* in print form; $\pounds 69/US \$138$ for both; $\pounds 5/US \$10$ extra for on-line access to each journal. Institutions: $\pounds 60/US \$120$ for print version of each journal; $\pounds 100/US \$200$ for print and on-line subscription combined. Students: $\pounds 25/US \$50$ per journal (on-line only); student membership is open to students registered at any institution of higher education in any country. Life membership for members over 65 with five years' membership, $\pounds 450$ or US \$900. Members can access the on-line archive of back volumes of the Society's journals via JSTOR for an extra $\pounds 10/\$15$ p.a.
