


7. The Annual Subscription is Forty Shillings, post free, and is payable in advance.

8. Single copies of back numbers, both of the present and the previous series, are on sale at Four Shillings each.





The Howarth-Jackson's Instruments are less expensive than other American or English models, and a further economy has been effected by rendering the instrument tips interchangeable, thus reducing the number of forceps handles and tips required. The lamps are 2.5 volt and more durable than the usual models.
