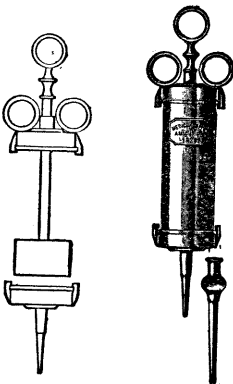

AN IMPROVED ASEPTIC SYRINGE

The defect of most piston and other Syringes which are filled through the nozzle is the great difficulty of keeping them "surgically" clean. This instrument, however, since its parts are made entirely of metal and readily separated, can be easily sterilised. Further, its makers have, at my suggestion, added a nozzle which, being detachable, not only enables the syringe to be filled without risk of contaminating its interior through an infected aperture, but also facilitates the cleaning of the nozzle itself, precautions of the utmost importance in aural treatment. This syringe is made in four sizes, viz. 1 oz., 2 oz., 3 oz., 4 oz., with nozzles of various sizes.
