
# ANTARCTIC Science



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### COVER

The ammonite Maorites densicostatus (Family Kossmaticeratidae), preserved within the López de Bertodano Formation on Seymour Island, James Ross Basin, Antarctic Peninsula. The ammonite is Late Cretaceous in age (Maastrichtian, ~ 70 million years old). The beautiful colours are due to the exceptional preservation of the original nacre ('mother of pearl') shell material.
