Letter to the Editor

To the Editor:

I read with interest the research note by Saunders (2) in the Summer 2003 issue of *International Journal of Technology Assessment in Health Care*. Although this article was published in 2003 and stated to have been a thorough review of hyperbaric oxygen randomized clinical trials, our double-blind randomized control trial in acute carbon monoxide poisoning published in 2002 (4) was not mentioned, except as a blinded interim analysis (3). Our randomized clinical trial was considered a landmark study by *Journal Watch–Emergency Medicine* (1). Our clinical trial demonstrated a 46 percent reduction in cognitive sequelae at 6 weeks following poisoning, which was maintained 1 year after poisoning.

I hope Dr. Saunders acknowledges these results and contemplates modifying his recommendations regarding the role of hyperbaric oxygen therapy for patients with acute carbon monoxide poisoning.

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
