- Submission of a disk or attachment is essential, as the article will be sent to international referees by email. The very much preferred format is MS Word. Material which is not accepted for publication will not be returned.

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- Submission of an article is taken to imply that it has not been previously published in English, and is not being considered for

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- First proofs of articles (but not reviews) will be sent to authors for correction, and must be returned to the editor Iain Torrance within four days of receipt. Corrections should be confined to typographical errors. Other corrections may be made only with the concurrence of an editor.
- Greek and Hebrew words, which should only be used sparingly, need not be transliterated.
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
