

OBITUARY

DR. JOSEPH HAMMOND BRYAN,
Washington, D.C., U.S.A. (1856-1935).

HAMMOND BRYAN, during many years and up to the end, has been an outstanding and well-loved figure in Laryngology on both sides of the Atlantic. He had spent five years in his youth as a surgeon in the American Navy ; he had been active during the World War ; and as he was a regular visitor to Europe, he was well-known in this country. He was an original thinker and a prolific writer, as may be seen by reference to the Transactions of the Americal Laryngological Association, in which body he long held office.

Dr. Bryan never married and his pleasant home in Washington with his two sisters dispensed gracious hospitality to all visitors. His dignified but cheerful presence and his attractive voice will be missed by many friends. He died at his home on February 3rd, 1935, of cerebral haemorrhage at the age of seventy-eight years.
