This symposium aims to bring together diverse aspects of the biology of the male gamete of animals and plants, to relate their structure to their function and to establish the extent of common ground between them. The book, which is extensively illustrated with many previously unpublished micrographs, contains up-to-date reviews coupled with the results of recent research by recognized specialists. The treatment of the plant kingdom is especially comprehensive with papers on the male gametes of algae, fungi, archegoniates and angiosperms. Contributions on animal gametes deal not only with topics of perennial interest such as motility and survival, but also with recent research on sperm proteins and enzymes. The unique synthesis of work on both animal and plant gametes contained in this book will make it essential reading for everyone researching or studying either field.

This reference work is an authoritative source of information for field botanists who wish to discover hybrids in the wild, and for professional botanists who wish to use hybrids for both research and teaching purposes. It also provides a stimulus for further research as for the first time the gaps and deficiencies in our knowledge are precisely defined. Every one of the 975 hybrids that has been recorded from the British Isles is represented here. Up-to-date data are provided on their appearance, identification, fertility and distribution, and on the results of any experimental work which has been carried out on them. A literature list is given for each hybrid, and an introductory section provides a more complete synthesis of information on the whole subject of hybridization than has hitherto been available. In addition, 464 hybrids between British species which have been found abroad but not yet in the British Isles are listed.
