Microstructure and Mechanical Behavior of Ag_CNP/2024Al Composites

Many aluminum alloys are based on precipitation strengthening, so by heat treatment aluminum alloys develop the optimum balance of mechanical properties. Additionally, aluminum alloys can be reinforced by second phase dispersion. Some aluminum alloys can be strengthened by second phase dispersion and by precipitation (aging).

The present work was aimed to study the effect of age treatment on an AA2024 Aluminum alloy (Al_{2024}) and Al_{2024} reinforced with carbon-coated silver Nanoparticles (Ag_CNP) . Microstructural and mechanical characterization is reported as a function of age treatment and Ag_CNP concentration.

The raw material used in this study was Al_{2024} commercial alloy and silver nanoparticles obtained by plasma discharge. The chemical composition of Al_{2024} is shown in Table 1.

The Al_{2024} powder was produced by machining a solid extruded bar. The machined metal shavings were mixed with Ag_CNP in different concentrations (0.00, 1.50, 2.50 and 3.0 wt. % Ag_CNP). Mixtures were mechanically milled in a high-energy horizontal mill (ZOZ CM01 Simoloyer) under argon atmosphere. Milled products were hot extruded to obtain a solid bar. Solution treatment at 495°C for 1 h and water quenched followed by aging treatment at 190°C for 2h was applied to all solid samples.

The age hardening responses of composites and unreinforced matrix alloy were characterized using Vickers microhardness measurement. Fig.1. shows the effect of Ag_CNP and heat treatment on mechanical properties. Evident difference after aging is observed, as well as, an important effect of concentration of Ag_CNP . From 0.0, 1.5, 2.5 and 3.0 wt. % of $Ag_C NP$ the increment observed was about of 29% compared with Al_{2024} T6. Higher Ag_CNP concentration has a negative effect on mechanical properties. However, this value is high than that reported for Al_{2024} -T6 [1].

The foils of the composites and matrix alloy for TEM analysis were jet polished with HNO₃ and methanol at -25°C. Fig. 2. shows the precipitate morphology in the composite after aging at 190°C for 2h, the tiny needle shaped precipitates are observed in the matrix. Spherical nanoparticles corresponding to Ag_CNP homogeneously distributed in the matrix are observed. There are some dislocations in the composite interacting with Ag_CNP and precipitates θ' distributed homogeneously were observed in the matrix




TABLE 1. Composition of the Al₂₀₂₄ used (wt.%) in this work.

FIG. 1. Variation of hardness as a function of $Ag_C NP$ content.




FIG. 2. Precipitate morphology in Ag_CNP/2024Al composite aged at 190°C
