## Submissions

Articles submitted for publication should be sent by email to the Managing Editors at ej@ioc.u-tokyo.ac.jp. Submission of a paper will be taken to imply that it is unpublished and is not being considered for publication elsewhere. Upon acceptance of a paper, the authors will be asked to assign copyright to Cambridge University Press.

Contributors are responsible for obtaining permission to reproduce any materials, including photographs and illustrations, for which they do not hold copyright and for ensuring that the appropriate acknowledgements are included in the manuscript.

All contributions in the journal are peer-reviewed.

### Manuscript preparation

Papers must be in English and in principle no more than 12,000 words in length, including footnotes, normally to be submitted by email attachment as a Word file. The title of the manuscript, author's name, institutional affiliation, address, email address, and an abstract of up to 200 words should appear at the top of the file. Submissions, or enquiries about prospective submissions, may be sent to the Editors via ej@ioc.u-tokyo.ac.jp.

## **Text conventions**

It is essential that contributors observe the journal's text conventions closely. Contributors should refer to the *Journal*'s rules of citation and points of style, which can be found at http://assets.cambridge.org/LJIL/asi\_ifc.pdf. In order to facilitate comprehension among the broadest possible readership, contributors will normally be expected to provide Chinese or Japanese fonts for terms, bibliographical references, names of places and personages, etc where applicable.

## Proofs

Only essential typographical or factual errors may be changed at proof stage. Resist the temptation to revise or add to the text. The publisher reserves the right to charge authors for correction of non-typographical errors.

A pdf offprint will be supplied to the contributor at no charge. Production of traditional offprints can be ordered for a small fee.
