On November 1st, 1962, the Medical Research Committee of the National Deaf Children's Society are holding a One-Day Conference at B.M.A. House, Tavistock Square, London, W.C.2. The emotional disturbances of the born deaf who cannot communicate are, at present, an almost unexplored field of psychiatry, and the purpose of the Conference is to interest the psychiatric profession in a new line of research necessary to establish this greatly needed specialist branch of child psychiatry.

The Chairman of the Conference will be Dr. G. E. Godber, C.B., D.M., F.R.C.P., D.P.H., Chief Medical Officer, Ministries of Health and Education and Home Office. Mr. Terence Cawthorne, F.R.C.S., Consultant Adviser in Otolaryngology to the Ministry of Health, will present the otologists' viewpoint, and the guest speaker will be Dr. Frank J. Kallmann of the New York Psychiatric Institute, Director of the New York State Mental Health Scheme.


