The Walter P. Reuther Archives of Labor and Urban Affairs at Wayne State University announces the award of Rockefeller Foundation Residencies in Humanities for the academic year 1990–91 to Dr. John Barnard, professor of history at Oakland University, Rochester, Michigan, and Dr. Kevin Boyle, assistant professor of history at the University of Toledo. Barnard, author of a biography of Walter Reuther and other works on the United Automobile Workers (UAW), will examine the challenges posed by market, workplace, and ideological changes since the mid-1960s as part of a comprehensive study of auto workers and the UAW. He will also complete the editing of a collection of Walter Reuther's papers. Boyle, whose scholarship has examined the UAW's political behavior in the 1960s, will investigate the routine interaction between the UAW and Detroit's black community on issues of mutual concern as well as the debate between the union's leadership and its black membership over job discrimination and racial tension in the plants.
