**Submission of manuscripts.** Authors are encouraged to submit their manuscripts with a covering letter by email to bci.editor@mmu.ac.uk. Microsoft Word documents are preferred but other formats such as WordPerfect are also acceptable. Full instructions for authors can be found at http://journals.cambridge.org/BCI.

**Proofs.** The corresponding author will receive, by email, page proofs for checking which they are required to return within three days of receipt. Textual changes in proof cannot normally be countenanced and the publisher reserves the right to charge authors for excessive correction of non-typographical errors.

Offprints. A .pdf proof of the published article will be emailed to the first author unless otherwise requested; printed copies may be purchased if ordered at proof stage on the form provided.
