Kallmann of the New York Psychiatric Institute, Director of the New York State Mental Health Scheme.

THE PSYCHIATRIC PROBLEMS OF DEAF CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS ONE-DAY CONFERENCE AT BRITISH MEDICAL ASSOCIATION HOUSE, TAVISTOCK SQUARE, LONDON, W.C.I, on Thursday, November 1st, 1962.

Purpose: An almost unexplored field in Psychiatry exists in the investigation and treatment of the emotionally disturbed deaf child who cannot communicate, and the diagnostic problems of the deaf mentally sub-normal, or psychotic child.

The purpose of this Conference is the stimulation of interest and a new line of Research by the psychiatric profession, leading to the development of greatly needed specialist knowledge, within Child Psychiatry, of the special needs of children with defective hearing.

Deaf children who appear to be emotionally disturbed may be sent to psychiatrists who then find it almost impossible to treat such children because of the lack of adequate communication. In the absence of specialist services in Child Psychiatry devoted to the deaf without speech, very little psychiatric treatment of such children can be undertaken.

The parents of deaf children, as well as educational psychologists, otologists and teachers, would be greatly helped by guidance based on psychiatric research such as it is hoped will be stimulated by this Conference.


