Baker Library of the Harvard University Graduate School of Business Administration has published the fourth edition of *Manuscripts in Baker Library: A Guide to Sources for Business, Economic & Social History,* compiled by Robert W. Lovett and Eleanor C. Bishop, approximately 400 pages. Over 1400 collections are described, ranging in date from the fifteenth century to the twentieth. The collections relate not only to business, but to economic, social and even diplomatic history as well. The fourth edition contains entries for over 130 collections added since 1969, and the index has been much expanded to include both new material and many more references to collections previously acquired. The History Department of the Milwaukee Public Museum has acquired the patent files of the Elgin National Watch Company (formerly one of the two largest American watch manufacturers), containing 15 cubic feet of patent specifications and drawings arranged in 152 separate subject files. The approximately 11,100 patents date from 1868 to 1962 and cover many horological topics including metallurgy, watch movement design, winding and setting devices, patent regulators, and manufacturing machinery. The Smithsonian Institution Archives has recently published two new titles in its Archives and Special Collections of the Smithsonian Institution: Guide to the Smithsonian Archives, which supersedes the 1971 Preliminary Guide to the Smithsonian Archives; and Guide to Manuscript Collections in the National Museum of History and Technology. The Illinois State Archives, Springfield, Illinois 62756, announces publication of the first comprehensive guide to its holdings, the *Descriptive Inventory of the Archives of the State of Illinois*. This volume contains 107 record groups and over 1750 series, with detailed and complete descriptions of the contents of each series. It includes records of the major executive, legislative, and judicial offices and agencies; territorial papers; federal and state census data; documents from internal improvements and public works projects; official files of state institutions dealing with transportation, banking and finance corporations, education, labor relations, law enforcement and corrections, and military affairs; U. S. General Land Office transactions; and material on state, federal, and local government. Records range from the territorial period to the present. The *Descriptive Inventory* costs \$20.00, including index and postage.

Rutgers University, in joint sponsorship with the National Park Service, the New Jersey Historical Commission, and the Smithsonian Institution, has begun to edit and publish the papers of Thomas A. Edison, which number more than two million pages. The publication of a comprehensive microfilm edition and a highly select letterpress edition in 15 to 20 volumes is contemplated. Rutgers has appointed Reese V. Jenkins as director and editor of the project and also as a member of the Rutgers University faculty in the Department of History. Additional faculty and editorial staff will be appointed in the next two years, and a major program in the history of technology and science will be developed in coordination with the Edison Papers.
