2. The Minor Operations.

These are performed at 9 a.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday.

3. The In-Patient Department. Major Operations.

These take place at 2 o'clock on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday. The list of operations is to be seen on the notice board in the Out-patient Consulting Room.

4. Lectures and Demonstrations.

Courses of Practical Instruction are given throughout the year by Members of the Staff, on Tuesdays and Fridays, at 3 p.m. punctually.
