## LIBRARIES

**Education and World Affairs** has established a Data Bank which will provide rapid and up-to-date answers to questions about the international dimensions of higher education in the United States. So far, it has processed a total of 2,185 programs at 522 U.S. universities and colleges. The information was obtained through questionnaires sent to the institutions, and is punched on EDP cards which can then be used to print selective inventories based on such variables as type of program, subject-matter, field, foreign country involved, and sources of funding. Examples of the type of analyses made possible by the data bank appeared in the February issues of EWA's publication, *Intercultural Education*. A tabular summary indicated that of the 2,185 programs, 408 involved study abroad for an academic year, and 405 comprised language and area studies. Of the latter, the largest numbers focus on Latin America (30.1%) and Asia (27.7%). EWA is a private, non profit organization largely funded by the Ford Foundation and Carnegie Corporation of New York. The Hoover Institution has now made available on microfilm an impor-

tant Cuban journal *Obra Revolucionaria* and the Argentine *Mundo Peronista*. *Obra Revolutionaria*, Havana, was for more than five critical years a primary organ for the dissemination of speeches, statements and documents of Cuban revolutionary and government leaders. Fidel and Raúl Castro, Ernesto Guevara and others are amply represented in this Cuban government publication, which supplements rather than duplicates Cuban newspapers. Issues from May 1960 to June 1965 are available. *Mundo Peronista* of Buenos Aires was the official publication of the Escuela Superior Peronista and began publication on July 15, 1951, appearing twice a month. The magazine is highly nationalistic, anti-communist and anti-North American; the greater part of the material is Peronist propaganda, including the regular feature for children which presented the doctrine of Eva and Juan Perón in fairy-tale format. On file are all issues up to number 90/91, August 1, 1955, a few weeks before Perón was ousted. Price of the Cuban journal, which comprises about 10 reels of microfilm is \$279.00; for the Argentine one, about 5 reels, \$143.00. This material may also be purchased in bound Xerox form. **A Preliminary Guide to Uncatalogued Hispanic American Sources in the De Forest Collection** is the title of the Bibliographical Series of the University of Louisiana's Latin American Studies Institute. This paper is by Nick Buford, a graduate student in the History Department at LSU. The George D. Forest Collection was acquired in 1965 and has been largely ignored by researchers and remains uncatalogued. The majority of the documents are Mexican, especially from Puebla, with a few from Ecuador and Guatemala and one each from Puerto Rico and Colombia. Many of the records are incomplete and there are often "huge gaps" in the periods covered. The collection includes "correspondence, manuscript volumes, pamphlets, judicial proceedings, last wills and testaments, poetry, recipes, cartoons, fragmented magazine articles, church records and related items, laws, treaties, a few broadsides, and one map, mining report and military report." Photos, microfilm, diaries, memoirs, newspapers, theses, dissertations, genealogies and bibliographies are also included in the collection, but not covered in Buford's Guide. The Kraus Collection of Manuscripts, donated by Hans P. Kraus to the Library of Congress in 1969 (see LARR V.2) is at present being prepared for microfilming. The collection comprises important documents of the Spanish Colonial period, including letters and documents relating to the explorers

Amerigo Vespucci, Giovanni da Verrazzano and Alvar Nuñez Cabeza de Vaca. To the original group of 117 manuscripts of the Zumárraga papers has been added a 1537 letter from Juan Zumárraga to the Emperor Charles V, acquired through the further generosity of Mr. Kraus. The microfilming of all the papers should be completed by July 1st, and scholars may order photographic copies of selected documents from the master negative film. Positive microfilm may be requested on inter-library loan. Certain unpublished manuscripts are to be issued in modern scholarly editions and will not be available for prior photographic reproduction. The entire collection, however, will be available for consultation by scholars upon the completion of the microfilm project.

The Hillman Library at the University of Pittsburgh has been developing a Cuban collection which is now estimated to be the fourth largest in the country. It contains more than 2,500 books dealing with revolutionary Cuba, as well as 34 Cuban journals; the official newspaper *Revolución* and its successor *Granma*; three publications by Cuban exiles: *Revista Cubana*, *Exilio* and *Nueva Generación*; monitored word-by-word accounts of Havana radio broadcasts; Peraza's annual bibliography of Cuban literature; and a statistical yearbook "Compendio Estadístico de Cuba" (1965-7). Latin American bibliographer Eduardo Lozano has exerted great effort in acquiring these holdings and is now in the process of purchasing current periodicals through the Instituto del Libro in Havana and in importing books from Cuba under authorization recently obtained from the U.S. Government.

The library of West Georgia College, Carrollton, Georgia, has recently acquired an important addition to their Latin American Collection: some 800 books from the library of a well-known Colombian historian. There are about 150 works on Simón Bolívar, the largest accumulation of Bolivariana in one place, as well as 75 volumes on his chief lieutenant, Francisco Santander, 10 books dealing with U.S.-Colombian dispute over Panamá and other works on Colombia history, pre-history, archeology, linguistics, geography, ethnography, folklore, literature and constitutional law. It also includes the entire set of 111 monographs published by the Colombian Academy of History, the 146

volume "Library of Colombian Culture". The collection was discovered by Eugene R. Huck, chairman of the Division of Social Sciences, while he was doing research on Santander in Colombia last fall.

It is hoped later to publish a second volume on the humanities, social sciences and the law. The final chapters give an analysis of the problems of Latin American Higher Education and science, with an account of Latin America's scientific links with the rest of the world.
