

SCOPE Epidemiology and Psychiatric Sciences (EPS) is an international, peer-reviewed journal providing updated data and scientific information to epidemiologists, psychiatrists, psychologists, statisticians and other research and mental health workers primarily concerned with public health and epidemiological and social psychiatry. Priority is given to original research and systematic reviews about mental health service research, aimed to improve the quality of everyday practice. EPS is published quarterly (in March, June, September and December).
