CONTRIBUTORS TO THIS ISSUE

William O. Aydelotte, Professor of History at the University of Iowa, is the author of *Bismarck and British Colonial Policy* and of essays in several books as well as various articles. He is a member of the Board of Directors of the Social Science Research Council.

Ann Beck, who is Associate Professor of History at the University of Hartford, has published articles on East Africa and is presently preparing a book on the British medical administration there. She has received several grants for her recent researches in England and East Africa.

Leon D. Epstein is Professor of Political Science and Dean of the College of Letters and Science at the University of Wisconsin. He is the author of *Britain* — Uneasy Ally and of *British Politics in the Suez Crisis*. His published articles include one in the Journal of British Studies.

Elizabeth Read Foster, Associate Professor of History at Ursinus College, is the editor of *Proceedings in Parliament 1610*. She has been acting director of the Yale Parliamentary Diaries Project and in September 1966 will assume the position of Professor of History and Dean of the Graduate School, Bryn Mawr College.

William M. Lamont is Lecturer in History and Education at the University of Sussex. His scholarly works include *Marginal Prynne* and a number of articles on the Puritan era.

Josiah C. Russell, Professor Emeritus of the University of New Mexico, is now Professor of History at Texas College of Arts and Industries. He is the author of *Late Ancient and Medieval Population*, of *British Medieval Population*, and of several articles on historical demography.

Lois G. Schwoerer, who is Assistant Professor of History at the George Washington University, is here publishing her second article on the standing army controversy.

L. J. Trinterud, California Professor of Church History at San Francisco Theological Seminary, is the author of *Forming of an American Tradition*. He has written articles on various aspects of sixteenth-century Protestantism and is currently at work on a volume of Tudor Puritan documents.
