

At a General Meeting of this Society, held on May 21st, Sir St Clair Thomson was elected an Honorary Fellow by the unanimous vote of the Fellows. It was the only new British nomination this year.


It is worthy of note that, with a membership now approaching five thousand, there are only twenty-three British honorary fellows of this Society. Sir St Clair Thomson is the first Laryngologist—indeed, we believe the first Specialist—on whom this distinction has been conferred. It is also noteworthy that the Society has twenty-seven Honorary Foreign Fellows and, of these, one is a Laryngologist, viz. Professor Chevalier Jackson. No other speciality has received such distinction.

The head rest enables the operator himself to place the patient in the desired position for a variety of operations. All parts touched by the operator are sterilisable.

The apparatus is an elaboration of Haslinger's Bronchoscopic head rest, but its range of utility is extended to enable the patient to be supported with the shoulders beyond the end of the table for esophagoscopy, and to be kept in the correct attitude during operations performed in the sitting or semi-sitting position.
