"THE PALPABLE OSLER"

The National Medical Audiovisual Center, part of the National Library of Medicine, has completed a video production of *The Palpable Osler*, a biography of Sir William Osler, M.D. (1849–1919). The life and accomplishments of Osler are presented through pictures selected from specialized collections including the archives of the National Library of Medicine, McGill University, and Johns Hopkins University.

The text of the programme, written and narrated by Charles G. Roland, M.D., of McMaster University and the American Osler Society, focuses upon the reasons for Osler's enduring influence in the field of medicine, including: his humanistic approach to medical practice; his insistence that medical education include clinical study; his authorship of the most widely-used general medical text of the time; and his active role in the establishment of societies, libraries, and journals for the communication of scientific knowledge.

The thirty-three-minute program is now available from the U.S. General Services Administration, National Audiovisual Center, Sales Program, Washington, DC 20409, in both videocassette and slide/tape formats. The price is \$75.00 for videocassettes and \$81.00 for the slide tape, plus postage and fifteen per cent handling.
