If competing essays are otherwise of equal quality, preference will be given to those topics relating to the history of Congregationalism.

Miller, Secretary, American Society of Church History, 305 East Country Club Lane, Wallingford, PA 19086, by 15 December 1981, with return postage included. No manuscript previously submitted will be considered. The award will be announced at the Spring meeting of the Society in 1982.

The 1980 winner of the Brewer Prize is "Preserving the Peace: Community Development and Ministerial Ideals in Revolutionary New Hampshire," by Douglas H. Sweet.
