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Psychiatric terms for mental health problems

Mental health specialists use a wide range of specific psychiatric diagnoses which are not usually needed by general health workers. However, you might come across these psychiatric terms if a person you are caring for has been seen by a specialist, or when receiving a back-referral from specialist care, or from people with mental health problems who have been reading about their condition. These terms are shown below, with differences depending on the diagnostic classification system used, and the sections where these disorders are considered in this manual.
