

Yale University Press is proud to announce the publication of a multimedia interactive database that will revolutionize the study of ancient Greek civilization, expanding the ways in which ancient Greek literature, history, art and archaeology can be examined. The database, named after the mythological hero who explored the limits of the known world, is published on CD-ROM with full colour images available on videodisc.

Perseus provides the beginning student with a solid introduction to Greek antiquity and also offers powerful research possibilities to the specialist. The first edition in the series, Perseus I.O, includes an overview of Greek history, works in Greek and in translation by ten authors from the archaeic and classical periods, an on-line version of Liddell and Scott's Intermediate Greek Lexicon, and a classical encyclopedia that glosses architectural terms and vase shapes. Among its thousands of illustrations are topographical maps of Greece annotated with place names, views — both still shots and motion pictures — of sites and scenes throughout Greece, and a catalogue of several hundred objects of Greek art.

Perseus is distributed in Hypercard and runs on Macintosh computers. The minimal configuration is a Mac Classic with hard disc, 2Mb of RAM, and an Apple-compatible CD player. The optimal, which provides capability for using digital images, is a Macintosh LC or better, with at least 4Mb of RAM, a hard disk, colour monitor and 8-bit colour-graphics board, and an Apple-compatible CD player. A videodisk player and video monitor can be used with either of these configurations to obtain the images available on videodisc.
