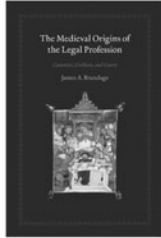
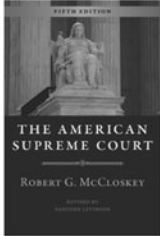

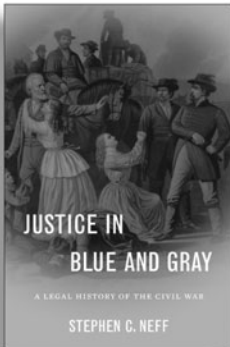

Submission of a manuscript is understood to commit its author to publish the manuscript in *Law and History Review* if accepted by the editor.
