JOURNAL POLICY

The Journal of Paleontology publishes original articles and notes on all aspects of paleontology that use fossils as a data base, including micropaleontology, invertebrate paleontology, vertebrate paleontology, paleobotany, and ichnology. Papers may emphasize any aspect of paleontology, including taxonomy, stratigraphic paleontology, paleobiogeography, paleoecology, paleobiology, evolution, taphonomy, and actualistic paleontology. In addition, comments on articles and replies, as well as comments on paleontological subjects of general interest, are considered for publication in the Journal. Book reviews may be submitted on topics of wide general interest. Memorials are considered on an individual basis. Manuscripts being considered for publication elsewhere are not to be submitted to this journal.

Paleontological and taxonomic notes are short contributions that do not include an abstract. Articles are longer papers that include an abstract. The Memoirs of The Paleontological Society are occasional publications consisting of major works that are too extensive for inclusion in the *Journal of Paleontology* as part of regular issues. Memoirs are published as supplements to regular issues of the *Journal* and full page costs must be provided by the author.

All manuscripts are submitted to the Managing Editor. The Technical Editors work with authors to produce final copy. The basic editorial structure for the *Journal* was described in 1986 (*Journal of Paleontology*, 60:2–3). By decision of the Council of the Society (*Journal of Paleontology*, 1985, 59: 789), "At least one author of a paper must be a member of The Paleontological Society. Otherwise full page costs must be paid. The editors should use their judgement in setting this rule aside for outstanding papers by authors who can neither join the Society nor pay page charges." All authors are requested to provide page charges if they can do so. Authors are charged for changes they make in proof and for original mistakes that must be corrected in proof.

Instructions for the preparation of manuscripts are published in each issue of the *Journal* and more detailed instructions were published in Hoare and Steinker (1987, *Journal of Paleontology*, 61:1289–1295). All manuscripts must adhere to the prescribed format.
