

## *An Invitation*

**P**ERHAPS you are not a member of the MLA but feel that the preparation of the MLA Style Sheet, and the wide distribution of it practically at cost, are enterprises worthy of your support. Such projects are made possible by no subsidy or endowment—merely by the dues paid annually by more than 6,500 members of an educational, non-profit society, and by the part-time labors of many of these members and their national officers. Annually the MLA presents the scholarly world with an indexed bibliography of books and articles published in its large field, and also with an indexed, international compilation of "Research in Progress." Six times a year the MLA sends its own members and subscribers an issue of its official organ, *PMLA*, normally with more than 300 pages of scholarly articles, reports, news, and announcements in each issue.

**M**ORE support means that we can do still more. For example, if sufficient support is forthcoming we hope to publish in the near future (1) a review of the aims, methods, and materials of literary and linguistic scholarship, (2) a survey of the resources for literary research in American libraries, (3) a study of scholarly reviewing in our field, (4) a report on the peculiar criteria and desiderata of journals in our field, (5) a report on the criteria and desiderata of American university presses, and other such collections of data.

**A**LTHOUGH our members are for the most part college or university teachers, others interested in our activities—graduate students, authors, publishers, librarians, laymen interested in literary studies—are welcomed as members. The MLA exists for the purpose of promoting literary and linguistic studies in all the fields of the modern languages and literatures, English and foreign. In an age of departmentalization, the MLA encourages the study of many languages and literatures. In an age of specialization, the MLA encourages *all* aspects of literary and linguistic study.
