HUGH ANDERSON

Within the framework of New Testament studies, Professor Anderson surveys critically the main lines of the 'Jesus of History'—'Christ of Faith' debate since the epochal work of Martin Kähler in 1892, concentrating especially on the phase associated with the name of Rudolf Bultmann. He does not confine himself to German trends and developments, but, investigating the work of leading British and American New Testament scholars, tries to account for some of the basic methodological and hermeneutical differences between German and Anglo-American Biblical scholarship, and to assess the merits and demerits of each side. 49s net
