

The Igbo-Igala Borderland

Religion and Social Control in Indigenous African Colonialism

By Austin J. Shelton

This ethnohistorical survey of the northern Nsukka borderland examines particularly one method of African colonial control. When, in the late 18th century, the Igala conquered the indigenous Igbo, they gained and held social control through monopoly of certain religious positions. However, despite conscious effort to maintain Igala religious lineages, these gradually became Igbonized. Dr. Shelton's description of religious activity in the borderland is clear and original. He makes extensive use of material gathered in the field.
