

# **Travel Tips**

- Travel to Canada now requires a passport for U.S. citizens, and possibly visas for international members
- Airline tickets should be issued with the full name on your passport
- International members will need a multiple-entry visa if transiting the U.S. to Canada
- Visit the Travel Security Administration website for latest security requirements, www.tsa.gov
- International members should consider round-trip direct flights to Canada without transiting the U.S.
- Apply for passports and any required visas well in advance of the meeting.

# **Passport Requirements**

U.S. citizens must have a valid passport to enter Canada. Be sure to review the U.S. Department of State guidelines at www.travel.state.gov/travel/cbpmc/cbpmc\_2223.html) and passport information at www.travel.state.gov/passport.

Attendees holding passports from countries other than the United States should review the Government of Canada visa and documentation requirements at www.canada.gc.ca/home.html.
