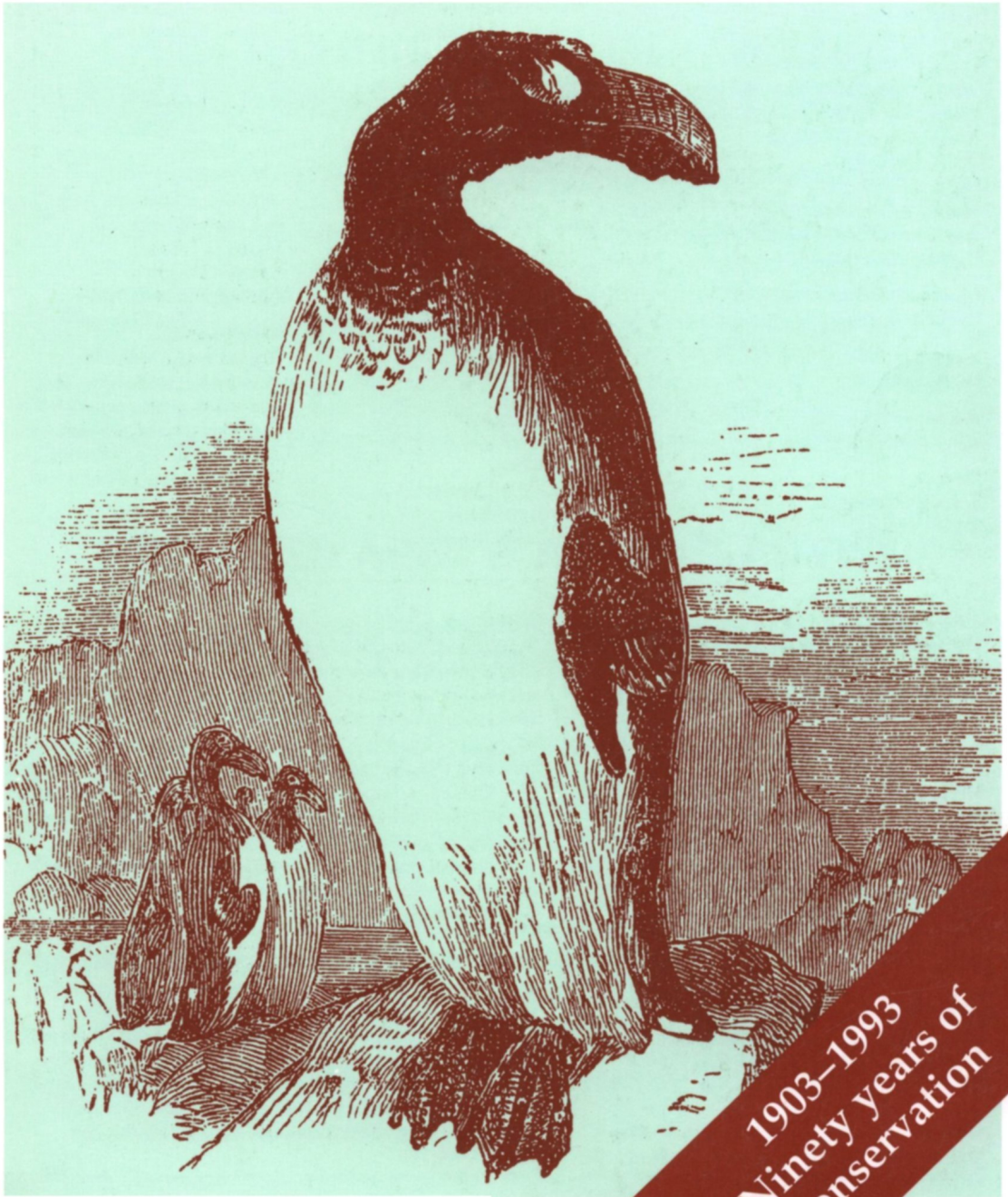
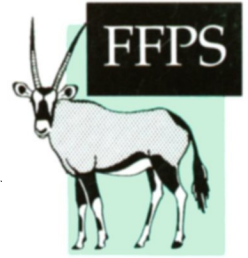

All animals feed selectively. The rumen of a cow will contain a biased sample of the vegetation; the size frequency of particles ingested by a marine worm will differ from that of the sediment in which it lives and a predator will prefer certain prey.
