The Research Program in International Security (RPIS) at Princeton University's Center of International Studies will award visiting post-doctoral fellowships for the academic year 1996-97.

RPIS was established to promote the study of the causes, character, consequences, and control of military rivalry and violent conflict, both within states and between them. The Program welcomes applications from scholars whose work addresses these issues, regardless of discipline or methodology. Visiting fellows will be in residence at Princeton during the 1996-97 academic year. Post-doctoral fellows (who must have their Ph.D. in hand by August 1996) will be expected to make substantial progress toward completion of a book-length manuscript and will receive a stipend of approximately \$33,000.





Cultural Realism is an in-depth study of premodern Chinese strategic thought that has important implications for contemporary international relations theory.
